Submit a **500-750 word essay** about the importance of community service and how you have demonstrated outstanding leadership during your high school years. We want to know about you! Submit a **resume or short bio and head shot**. We also need a **copy of your high school transcript**, and **two letters of recommendation**, one should be a personal recommendation (family/friend/associate) who can comment on your character and one from someone who witnessed your community service or leadership skill.

The award recipients will be eligible to receive funds when proof of admission and enrollment to their school of choice is submitted to the committee. The African American Unity Center (AAUC), a 501c3 nonprofit organization, will receive any funds identified for this scholarship opportunity in partnership with the LA Sentinel, Mother's In Action and Taste of Soul.
